Plant communities: Redwood Forest, Mixed Evergreen Forest, Yellow Pine Forest, Red Fir Forest [[Lum/Walker](#), [CNPS](#)]

Habitat: described by Walker and/or CNPS as occurring under dry conditions in slope habitats [[Walker](#) and/or [CNPS Inventory 1994](#)]

Elevation: between 0 and 8000 feet [[Lum/Walker](#)].

Lithocarpus densiflorus, a dicot in the family Fagaceae, is a tree or shrub that is **native** to California [[Hrusa](#)] and is also found outside of California, but is confined to western North America [[Lum/Walker](#) and [Hickman](#)].
