Everett M. Hansen is emeritus professor of Forest Pathology in the Department of Botany and Plant Pathology, Oregon State University, in Corvallis. He has been at OSU since 1972, with sabbatical years with Forest Research in England, the Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences in Uppsala, and with INRA in Nancy, France. He has a BS in Forest Management from OSU and graduate degrees in Plant Pathology from the University of Wisconsin, Madison. He is interested in many aspects of forest pathology, including the effects of pathogens on forest ecosystems, population genetics and evolutionary biology of pathogenic fungi, strategies to limit disease spread and intensification, and silvicultural control of forest pathogens. In recent years his lab has focused on *Phytophthora* species in forest ecosystems. Special attention has gone to breeding for resistance to *P. lateralis*, and the epidemiology of *P. ramorum*, as well as discovery of the indigenous *Phytophthora* assemblage in forests. Hansen is a Fellow of the American Phytopathological Society.
